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Basic Rules for Shipping Firearms

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Some basic rules include:

- Make the firearm inoperable by removing the bolt, firing pin, trigger assembly, and other arming parts.
- \geq Remove all ammunition from the firearm.
- Ensure the firearm information is written on the inventory: make, model, serial number, unique characteristics, and caliber or gauge.
- Firearms shipped in containerized shipments must be placed in the number one container to insure easy access by custom officials.



Limitations & Prohibitions

- DTR Chapter 409 provides policy and procedures for movement of Privately Owned Firearms (POF) and ammunition, both interstate and import/export, to and from the US.
- NO importation of foreign and/or domestic semi-automatic assault weapons
- NO importation of machineguns, short barrel shotguns, short barrel rifles, silencers, destructive devises and certain other concealable firearms
- > NO privately owned ammunition

Authorization

- Within CONUS: members authorized to ship conventional firearms, antique firearms and surplus military firearms (must posses licenses and permits or documents as required by law)
- Exporting Firearms/Ammunition FROM the US: members must have CBP Form 4455, Certificate of Registration, completed PRIOR TO departure from the US OR must have proof of possession established by a bill of sale, receipt or other documentation. Item must be shown on inventory or packing list.
- Importing Firearms TO the US: shipment of firearms to the US are subject to the following
 - Member must be on active duty outside the US or have been on active duty outside the US within the 60-day period preceding importation (member must pay any Customs duty)
 - Firearms must be suitable for sporting purposes and firearms that are prohibited may not be imported. Surplus military firearms may NOT be imported
 - > The firearms must be intended solely for personal use not resale or as a gift
 - Import must be to the place of residence at members' Permanent Duty Station (PDS)
 - Import must be IAW all federal, state, territorial and local laws

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Member Responsibilities

Members must:

- Ensure all laws and regulations of the US and its territories, foreign countries, and municipalities are complied with regarding the possession, carrying, registration, and shipment of POFs.
- Obtain and provide copies, upon request, of documentation authorizations, individual licenses, or registration forms for the firearms to be shipped as a part of an authorized personal property shipment.
- Ensure all firearms are free of explosive charges when turned over for shipment.
- Compliance with all laws are member responsibility
 - Local and state laws vary regarding possession and registration of firearms.



Guam Customs Process for Firearms

- Any shipment containing firearms will be moved to a Container Freight Station (CFS)
- Transportation Service Provider (TSP aka moving company) destination agent notifies Personal Property Shipping Office (PPSO) in Guam
- TSP coordinates clearance between Guam Customs and service member
- If member not available, PPSO will act on member's behalf to extract firearms in order to release shipment to destination warehouse
- Charges will apply in addition to normal customs clearance charges
- TSP destination agent is responsible to coordinate with Guam Customs on the movement of shipments from the port to a CFS facility selected by the TSP.
