

ATMs-at-Sea Program Contract History

- ◆ Idea originated by AIRLANT: 1979
- ◆ Prototype development 1982-85
- ◆ ATMs-at-Sea I -- Aug 88 to Oct 93
- ◆ ATMs-at-Sea II -- Oct 93 to May 98
- ◆ ATMs-at-Sea III – Sep 98 to Aug 02
- ◆ ATM-at-Sea III Bridge Contract -
Sep 02 to Feb 03
- ◆ ATM-at-Sea IV – Feb 03 to Feb 07



**Off-line closed system using ship-issued cards
that are good only on that ship.**

First Use of ATMs at Sea

- ◆ Navy-unique stand-alone system in operation since 1988... used as a pay delivery system
- ◆ Ship specific ATM cards ... withdrawals only
- ◆ DFAS “pushes” money twice a month from pay to ATM system
- ◆ ATMs-at-Sea system installed on 120 ships with over 210 ATMs

ATMs-at-Sea Program Benefits

- ◆ Eliminated pay lines twice a month
- ◆ Reduced paycheck issue by 90 percent
- ◆ Decreased cash handling requirements
- ◆ Reduce opportunity for theft -- money is safe in ATM machines
- ◆ Provides sailors 24-hour access to personal funds
- ◆ Reduces Disbursing Office workload



Worldwide Maintenance

- 21 CONUS, 15 OCONUS supported ports
- 24 X 7 hotline....One Touch effective 4 Apr 00

Hardware/Software

- Software problems analyzed and resolved in Dayton lab
- Tech visits to ships to resolve hardware problems
- Annual preventative maintenance visits
- Monthly NAVSUP maintenance advisory messages

Navy – Marine Cash Prototype

Next generation cashless ATMs, running on shipboard LAN, providing electronic banking via satellite, and stored value e-purse for retail sales.

- ◆ Electronic Banking -- off-line access afloat to all personal funds at banks and credit unions ashore.
- ◆ Electronic Purse -- Cashless environment within lifelines of the ship.
- ◆ Debit Card – Use with commercial vendors.

Desired State:

Transferable financial card to be used ship to ship, ship to Navy Bases and commercially accepted worldwide.

- Today, Navy has installed ATM systems on all surface ships, except for the Oliver Hazard Perry class of frigates.
- Most afloat ATM machines are 5 to 10 years old but were upgraded as part of Y2K technology infusion.
- Plan to support current system for the next 4 years until replaced by Navy Cash™.

ATM system has served Navy well for last 15 years
